

# The 2010 Presidential Management Fellowship (PMF)

The PMF program is a leadership development program that provides opportunities to work with and impact public policy, serve one's country and receive competitive pay, benefits, career development, and a non-competitive appointment to a full-time, permanent position upon completion of the fellowship.

This program includes training, developmental assignments, accelerated promotions, and opportunities to work between agencies. Fellows are hired to work on domestic and international issues in public administration, technology, criminal justice, health, financial management, national security, and many other fields.

Outstanding graduate students (including law students) are encouraged to apply. This program is ideal for any student interested in a management career with the federal government.

All 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year students who will complete their degree requirements between September 1, 2009 and August 31, 2010 are eligible to apply for this two-year, post-graduate fellowship with the federal government.

Interested students must also be nominated by Suffolk University Law School in order to be considered for a Presidential Management Fellowship.

To apply, you must follow this two-step process:

**Step One:** Apply on-line at [www.USAJOBS.gov](http://www.USAJOBS.gov) (or via the PMF website which will link you to the USAJobs website). When you apply, you MUST print out the OFFICIAL PMF NOMINATION FORM.

**Step Two:** Submit a cover letter outlining your qualifications for and interest in the PMF program, resume, and transcript, along with the PMF OFFICIAL NOMINATION FORM, to Maureen Ricciuti, Career Counselor, in the Career Development Office by noon on October 15, 2009. Your cover letter must be addressed to Interim Dean Bernard Keenan. Dean Keenan is the PMF nomination official for SULLS.

You MUST complete BOTH the online application and submit the nomination materials to Maureen Ricciuti by noon on October 15, 2009 to fulfill the application requirements. If you do not do so, you will be disqualified from the application process.

Attorney positions for PMFs are rare, most often law student PMFs obtain appointments such as policy analyst, budget analyst, estate tax examiner, contract specialist, hearings and appeals specialist, or other non-attorney positions. Federal attorney positions are filled under a separate excepted service hiring authority outside of the PMF program.
